WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published in accordance with law, said proposed budget was open for inspection by the public at a designated place, a public hearing was held on December 7, 2017, and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

- Section 1. <u>Summary of 2018 Revenues and 2018 Expenditures</u>. That the estimated revenues and expenditures for each fund for fiscal year 2018, as more specifically set forth in the budget attached hereto, are accepted and approved.
- Section 2. <u>Adoption of Budget</u>. That the budget as submitted, amended and attached hereto and incorporated herein is approved and adopted as the budget of the Central Clear Creek Sanitation District for fiscal year 2018.
- Section 3. <u>Levy of General Property Taxes</u>. That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for the General Fund for operating expenses from property tax revenue is a total amount of \$17,000 and that the 2017 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Clear Creek County Assessor, is \$5,234,140. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expenses of the District during the 2018 budget year, there is hereby levied a total tax of 3.248 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2017.
- Section 4. Levy of Debt Retirement Expenses. That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for the Debt Service Fund for debt retirement expense from property tax revenue is \$80,658 and that the 2017 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Central Clear Creek Assessor, is \$5,234,140. That for the purposes of meeting all debt retirement expenses of the District during the 2018 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 15.410 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2017.
- Section 5. <u>Certification to County Commissioners</u>. That the Secretary of the District, is hereby authorized and directed to immediately cause to have certified to the County {00314558}

Commissioners of Central Clear Creek County, the mill levy for the District hereinabove determined and set forth on the Certification of Tax Levies for Non-School Governments attached hereto.

Section 6. <u>Appropriations</u>. That the amounts set forth as expenditures and balances remaining, as specifically allocated in the budget attached hereto, are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for the purposes stated and no other.

Central Clear Creek Sanitation District organized under the Title 21 Colorado Special District Act and utilizes the accrual method of accounting. The District was established to provide sanitation services to the District. The wastewater treatment facility was placed in service in January 1976. The District is responsible for maintaining the sewer mains, billing homeowners and collecting usage charges and fees.

The District has no employees and contracts out for management and sewer operation services.

2018 BUDGET SUMMARY

The Districts strategy in preparing the 2018 budget is to continue to provide sanitation services at a reasonable cost to the property owners and residents while seeking to increase reserves for capital expenditures.

LOCATION AND SERVICE AREA

The Central Clear Creek Sanitation District serves the towns of Downieville, Lawson and Dumont, and an area along Mill Creek Road that extends about one mile north of Dumont. Most of the service are is located within the Downieville-Lawson-Dumont census-designated place (CDP) which has a total area of 0.9 square miles.

WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM

The wastewater from the service area flows by gravity to the Central Clear Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant. The District has one lift station which serves a small isolated area in the collection system. The service area has 3 main interceptors which have a total of 30,790 feet (5.8 miles) of 8-inch diameter sewer pipelines and 119 manholes.

SANITATION FEES

The adopted charge for the flat rate sewer usage was raised from 47.38 EQR to 54.49 EQR due to begin January 2018. This is an increase to the District users of approximately 15%. The total projected sanitation revenue for 2018 is projected to be \$217,350.

Interest income provides minimal revenue to the District.

PROPERTY TAX

The District Board of Directors levies property taxes based on Clear Creek County Assessors valuation. The levy is set by December 15 with certification to the County to put the tax lien on individual properties as of January 1 of the following year. Clear Creek County collects the taxes during the following year.

The taxes levied are based on the assessed value multiplied by the adopted mill levy. The current assess value for the Central Clear Creek Sanitation District was determined by Clear Creek County to be \$5,234,140. The District adopted mill levy for Governmental operations as 3.248 mills; for the property tax revenue of \$17,000. 15.410 mills providing tax revenue of \$80,658 for repayment of the general obligation debt incurred for the modifications of the WWTP.

On May 6, 2014 the District secured voter approval for a \$3,100,000 increase in debt with a maximum annual revenue of \$206,000. The ballot issue authorizing the debt and tax increases passed 114 to 57. However, the District was awarded a \$1,000,000 DOLA grant and well as a \$250,000 Design and Engineering Grant.
